


Sanctuary Soup Shelf : Bring canned food to the back of the narthex

Reopening Task Force Updates

GOOD NEWS! As we all continue to work together to stop the spread of COVID-19, we have exciting updates to our Augustana Reopening Progression. Remember, our goal is to ensure a safe worship environment for all who attend, including unvaccinated children and attendees who are at high risk of infection.

1. Masks at 8 a.m. outdoor worship are now optional for FULLY vaccinated individuals, who can decide whether or not to wear a mask. We will follow the honor system.
2. We will still be asking everyone to wear a mask at the 10:30 service, because beginning this Sunday, June 20, the congregation can resume singing! As we have noted before, indoor singing is a higher-risk activity due to expelling of respiratory droplets that can hang in the air for hours, so singing with masks will initially be required. *“Make a joyful noise to our Lord!”*
3. Registrations will continue, but the deadline for registrations has been extended to 7 a.m. Sunday morning. Registration continues for capacity monitoring and good record keeping in the event of contract tracing.
4. Social distancing with seating will continue with self-seating upon arrival and self-dismissal.

We rely on our congregation to make good decisions that are in line with the CDC, local, state, and Rocky Mountain Synod guidelines, upon which these recommendations have been based.

These recommendations by your Task Force have been approved by your Congregation Council. Stay tuned for further progress with movement forward as we go through the summer months. Feel free to contact the pastors or anyone on the Task Force with your questions or comments.
